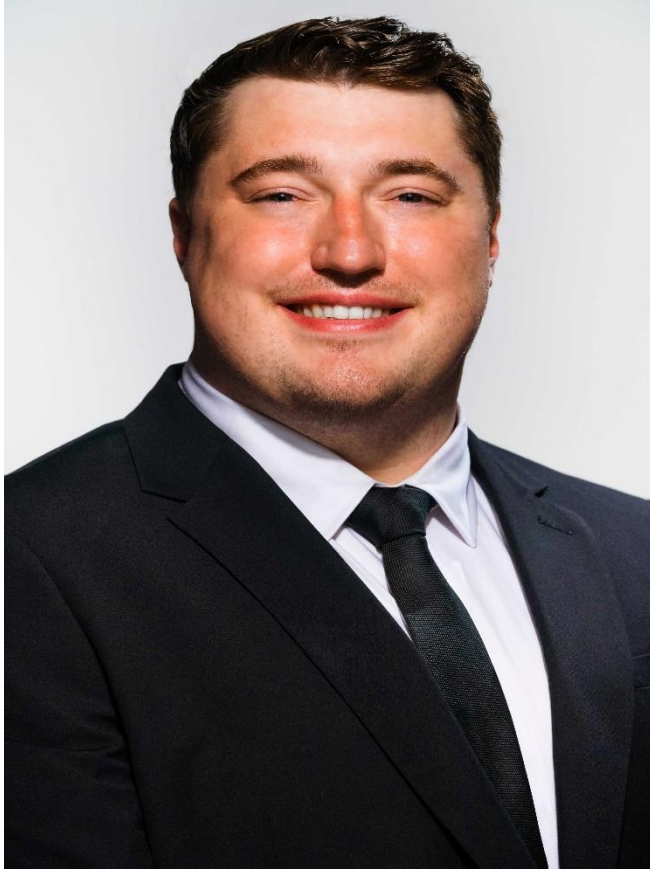


Nomination for CPMEC Junior Doctor of the Year Award 2022



QUEENSLAND – Dr Daniel BRIMM

Dr Brimm is a PGY1 at the Rockhampton Hospital and describes himself as an ‘educator at heart’. He provides bedside teaching for his medical students and teaches a variety of skills at medical student workshops from clinical examinations to suturing.

Daniel has created and delivered an anatomy review session for the second-year medical students at the University of Queensland. He has organised and delivered the first orthopaedics review session for fourth year medical students. In addition, he has appeared in several Q&A panels to field questions from final year medical students who are interested in a rural intern year.

Daniel regularly presents at the Department of Orthopaedic Surgery journal club and is a mentor with the Australasian Surgical Students’ Association.

Daniel has co-authored multiple papers in biomechanics; he is first author on a paper currently under review investigating the epidemiology of sports injury hospitalisations in Queensland. He is also an accomplished essayist, having won the Catherine Thorpe-Cramb prize for best essay on doctor’s mental health, and the Eric W. Peat memorial prize in medical ethics.
